Europe on the move

- Clean, competitive and connected mobility (31 May 2017)
- Clean Mobility Package
 (8 November 2017)
- 3. Safe, clean and connected mobility (17 May 2018)



Main objectives

Provide regulatory framework for road transport sector in the 2020s:

- Clean and climate friendly ("decarbonised") mobility
- Digitalised and connected mobility
- Fair and competitive mobility
- Safe mobility








Figure 6: Trend of HDV activity versus GHG emissions

Mobility package 1: road package

6 major amendments and 1 new initiative:

- Market pillar:
 - Access to the profession: vans; letterbox companies (1071/2009/EU), Access to market: cabotage (1072/2009/EU), Hired vehicles (2006/1/EC)
- Social pillar:
 - Enforcement of social legislation (2006/22/EC), posting of drivers (lex specialis, new), driving and rest time (561/2006/EC), tachograph (165/2014/EU)



Other initiatives influencing road transport

5 amendments and 1 new initiative:

- Digitalisation: eFTI and EETS
- Demand side measures: Eurovignette, Combined Transport and Buses and Coaches
- Decarbonisation: CO₂ standards and Clean Energy Vehicles,
 Weights and Dimensions
- Safer mobility proposals



Progress in negotiations: road package

- EP report was rejected by the plenary in June and sent back to Committee. Timing and new position unclear
- Council is trying to achieve General Approach by December 3rd. Important differences still between the Member States
- Potential impacts depends if and when the positions of the institutions will be established, and what compromises will be achieved in trilogies
 - Important for the Commission: balance



Progress: other files

- EETS political agreement hoped still in December
- Combined Transport EP position adopted, in Council subject to road package progress, deal theoretically possible during this EP
- eFTI: Council aiming only for progress report in December
- Eurovignette and Buses&Coaches have not progressed
- Decarbonisation and safer mobility proposals some progress



Timeline

- If Council or European Parliament do not have a negotiation position yet: very tight for this legislative period
- If a political agreement is found between Council and EP by early 2019 adoption during current EP possible
- If no political agreement between Council and EP by early 2019 delay due to EP elections in May 2019, no deal before 2020
- Entry into force usually 2 years later for Directives (transposition deadline)
